Proposed Action Description:

The UC Lawrence Berkeley National Laboratory (UC LBNL or Berkeley Lab) proposes to lease a two-bedroom, two-bathroom, fully furnished condominium from approximately January 2019 until approximately June 2019, with the possibility of extending or renewing the lease as needed at a later date. The condominium would be used to lodge scientists and technical staff visiting and/or conducting LBNL-related research at the nearby Sanford Underground Research Facility (SURF). The condominium would provide temporary residential "surge" space during an anticipated period of heightened activity (including for final assembly of the LUX-ZEPLIN project and upgrades to the MAJORANA experiment). Following this period of increased need, the lease would not be renewed.

Description of Affected Environment:

This condominium is in a residential area of the town of Lead, South Dakota.
