Proposed Action Title: DOE Purchase of Building 2040 from IVH, LLC

<u>Program or Field Office</u>: Office of Science – ORNL Site Office Location(s) (City/County/State): Oak Ridge, Tennessee

Proposed Action Description:

ORNL has a substantial and permanent need for additional office space that would provide a centralized location for ORNL Computing and Computational Sciences Directorate (CCSD) staff. In the near future, it is anticipated that continued growth in hiring as well as reduction in existing CCSD office space due to expanding computing systems will further exacerbate an office shortfall. While relocating personnel to offsite leased space is a possibility, it would undermine ORNL goals to modernize and centralize Laboratory operations. Thus, DOE seeks to purchase Building 2040 which is located on the western portion of the ORNL campus. No other office space was identified as currently available at the ORNL site and that would meet the needs of CCSD operations. The Laboratory already leases 122 offices of the 393 offices available in Building 2040, and the purchase of this building would remove the need to continue leasing from a third party. Adjacent to the building are nearly 550 parking spots that would be included in the purchase.

There are no special utility needs as the existing office space would be sufficient for the intended purpose. No hazardous operations, decontamination, or decommissioning requirements are anticipated with acquiring the facility.

The proposed action would take place within the Oak Ridge National Laboratory footprint and have been reviewed in accordance with the National Historic Preservation Act Historic Preservation Plan¹and applicable sections in a ratified Programmatic Agreement document and would not result in an adverse effect to historic properties included or eligible for inclusion in the National Register of Historic Places (National Register).
